## ASIA

In **Karachi and Lahore, Pakistan,** join *Aurat March*- a public march to ensure economic, political, and reproductive justice, and to celebrate women's struggle. There will also be a tribute to late Asma Jehangir, Pakistani human rights lawyer and activist. Follow the hashtag #Aurat-March2018

## RUSSIA

In **Moscow, Russia**, on 8-10 March there will be a festival "Feminism in the 2000s: Art, Media, Literature and New Practices". Female activists and professionals from art, reading groups, libraries and women-led SMEs and student organizations will discuss with the audience modern and urgent strategies for the Russian feminist movement. #### AFRICA

In Johannesburg, South Africa, Oxfam South Africa is supporting the Open Society Initiative for Southern Africa (OSISA) who will be launching a journal on African Women's Experiences and engaging young people on conversations about youth in Africa: https://twitter.com/OSISA/status/969527956228968448

In **Monrovia, Liberia**, the Ministry of Gender in Monrovia and 2 other provinces will be marking Women's Day, and Oxfam and partners will be participating in this.

In **Malawi** the Ministry of Gender, Children, Disability and Social Welfare will be marking Women's Day with women's rights organisations and partners. The Guest of Honour will be the First Lady of the Republic.

In **Rabat, Morocco**, a public sit-in will be organized in front of the Parliament on 8th March, by a national coalition of women's rights organisations gathered together.

In **Casablanca, Morocco**, a national conference on the judicial and procedural issues of the Family Code (Moudawana) and their impact on women's rights will be organized by the organization FLDF  $8^{th} \& 9^{th}$  March.

## LAC

At the **Regional level**, Oxfam will be supporting LATFEM's demand for justice for the 56 girls who were burned in Guatemala last March, and the social media campaign of Ni Una Menos in Argentina. We will also be supporting and standing with the feminist movement in Latin America.

In **Colombia** Oxfam is supporting 20 feminist organizations under the slogan #NosotrasParamos. There are several have planned activities: seedlings, social media campaigns, actions with communicators.

In **Nicaragua**, Oxfam is supporting national and local marches, exhibition of photographs, bicycle tours and theatre.

In **Santo Domingo, Dominican Republic,** on 8<sup>th</sup> March 'FemConcert' is happening at Centro Cultural de España, dedicated to respected Dominican feminist, late Magaly Pineda.

Also in Santo Domingo, women will join for the International Women's Strike on 11<sup>th</sup> March.

In **Santiago, Dominican Republic**, there will be a women's March on 8<sup>th</sup> March.

## PACIFIC

In the **Solomon Islands**, young people will be marching under the 'Side by Side' Banner which aims to change attitudes and beliefs of young people towards gender equality. The event will also feature an information stall with partner organisations and an 'Equality Olympics' featuring a series of tasks that demonstrate key concepts relating to equality, such as burden of unpaid care, temporary special measures etc.

In **Vanuatu** there will be a half day event with many activities including pictures and interviews with women leaders speaking on the theme "Time Is Now", women leaders from partner organizations sharing experiences and challenges in their work and a hand printing activity to allow those attending to share their thoughts on the day.
